Caravan Escape Room

Picture the scene:

Lockdown is confined to the history books and you've reserved a pitch on the glorious Isle of Wight. As you arrive at the ferry port, the sun is shining from a cloudless sky and you're looking forward to spending time at the beach, on a steam train, or visiting attractions you last saw as a child. With 30-minutes until departure, your party ventures into the caravan for a cup of tea, where events take a turn. Somehow, you all become trapped in the caravan and the only way out is to solve a series of puzzles that allow you to pass from room-to-room, the last clue granting access to the outside world. Why does this always happen when there's a ferry to catch!

Which caravan?

Visit baileyofbristol.co.uk and take a look at the Phoenix range of caravans. Choose a model that resembles the layout of your caravan, as the order of the challenges depend on layout.

Phoenix 420 (2-berth) – Page order: 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6

Phoenix 440 (fixed bed, end washroom) – Page order: 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6

Phoenix 640 (end bedroom, centre washroom) – Page order: 3, 1, 2, 4, 5, 6

Phoenix 642 (twin beds, end washroom) – Page order: 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6

Phoenix 644 (transverse island bed, end washroom) – Page order: 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6

Phoenix 650 (Bunk beds, end washroom) – Page order: 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6

Phoenix 760 (bunk beds, centre washroom) - Page order: 3, 1, 2, 4, 5, 6

Don't have a caravan? Simply choose your favourite Bailey Phoenix and use the rooms in your house in order of layout.

All good games deserve a timer and ours will be a cup of tea. Coffee is optional, as are biscuits. With pages printed and arranged to suit your caravan, make a cup of tea and leave outside the caravan. If the tea is cold and undrinkable when you emerge, the ferry has departed, and you've sadly lost. To maximise your chances, don't add too much milk and make sure the water is freshly boiled...

IMPORTANT. Choose a player to be Team Member One and only allow them to see Page One.

FOR TEAM MEMBER ONE'S EYES ONLY!

Read the following to the rest of your team:

'As if things couldn't get worse, one of your team has become stuck in the shower cubicle! Team Member One (from inside the shower cubicle with the screen door closed) will describe the following caravanning items to the rest of the team WITHOUT using the item's name or any of the words it may contain. Charade-style actions are allowed but the opaque door may hamper progress. Your escape depends upon your team guessing each item correctly.'

E.g. A clue for towing mirrors could be 'they attach to the car and allow you to see behind.'

Clues:

3. Fly screen
4. Air conditioning
5. Caravan & Motorhome Club
6. Corner steady
7. Fixed bed
8. Gas locker
9. Bunk beds
10. Fridge

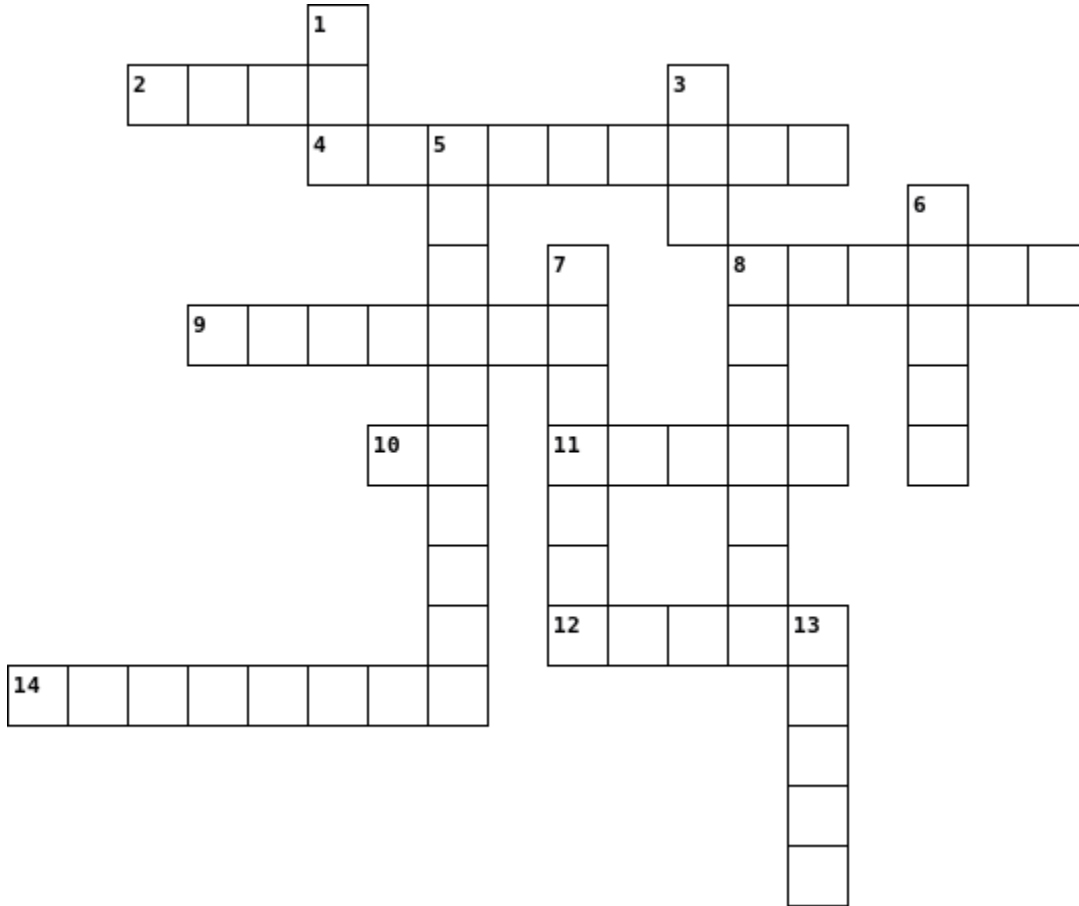
